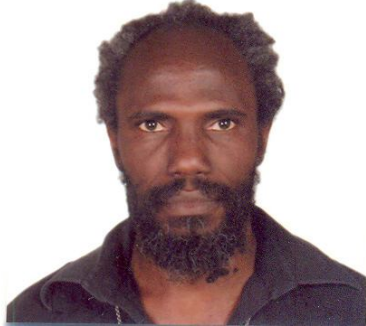


## **Jahlani A.H. Niaah**

Niaah is a lecturer in Cultural Studies and the Coordinator of the Rastafari Studies Unit at the Institute of Caribbean Studies, University of the West Indies (UWI) Mona Campus, Jamaica. Niaah for more than a decade has been working on the linkages between the African Diaspora and the continent.
